

No	Location	Description (The 'purists' will complete the route WITHOUT looking at this column !)
1	gate post at rear of property (note small plaque below)	white hall right, inside gate post at rear of property and entrance from old road
2	stone (large)	hanging stone large rock next to wooden trellis / ladder, in stone (on the W side)
3	Pillar (horizontal)	footpath, right of small coppice, wide grass track on horizontal stone pillar
4	where stream enters culvert	below errwood dam. On E side of wide track leading to dismantled railway. On a coping stone on L where stream enters culvert
5	end of bridge	W end of bridge over Goyt's Lane. On RHS of arch
6	not inside	On the BACK of shrine - facing N
7	stone on path	Stone at ground level
8	tunnel	dismantled railway tunnel, on RHS of the wall, near tunnel, 3 ft from ground
9	near trig point	E of trig pillar, in a wall by fence (on same side of fence as trig)
10	bridge wall	derbyshire bridge, W end of bridge, and low down near a young river goyt
11	footbridge	under a wooden bridge on road side of bridge
12	above gates	above metal gates at road / path junction, below a tree and carved in a post / stone
13	large gate pillar	large gate posts LEADING to errwood hall ruins, on a wider path to W of ruins, inner post, outer edge. NOT AT RUINS
14	end of small culvert - off wide forest track bend	W end of a small culvert at bend in forest track. Need to get low down to see numbers.....
15	footbridge	under the footbridge spanning the goyt, on the E side
16	L of sheepgate in wall at junction	About 9 feet L of sheepgate in a wall
17	bridge wall	as approaching bridge on the right hand side of the wall
18	12 feet from stile	N side of the lane, 12 feet L of stile in the wall
19	open shelter	open (no roof) shooting hut, inside, and below N facing window
20	south side exterior wall (weather worn)	over the ground floor window carved in a large supporting stone, very weather worn (will take you back to 1)

Notes

These are numbers **carved in stone** and scattered in the Goyt and Combs area.

The numbers can be found on bridges, gate posts and in walls.

They are about 2" high and represent either a 6 figure grid reference or a compass bearing and distance in yards xxx yyy(y).

Each clue denotes the location of the next marker. There are 20 in total over a distance of approximately 18 miles

Clue 1 is located to the rear of the White Hall Centre, access from Old Road only (not Long Hill)

Highly recommended to run/walk as a pair / group, for both safety and to search for the numbers

Pen/pencil and paper needed unless you have a very good memory

Route covers some high and remote ground, and can be very challenging in poor weather

Do not underestimate the time needed to find some of the numbers. Check carefully that you're in the correct location.

Control 12 - grid reference is somewhat inaccurate, start looking for the feature well (200 yd) to the north of the GR
